You can now do this very thing from the comfort of your armchair..... There are several internet sites that allow you to take over the use of the Amateur Radio Base Station in the USA or in Australia. Take a look at www.daves-portal.com for access to the VK3UR Internet Remote Base. The system is located in Ballarat, Victoria approx 100 km West of Melbourne and runs a Kenwood 2000X with a variety of antennas. You can apply for a listening only facility by supplying your call sign details or full Tx/Rx capability by sending a copy of your licence.. The associated W4MQ software will give you full control of the Rx and Tx functions and even allow you to control the antenna rotation.

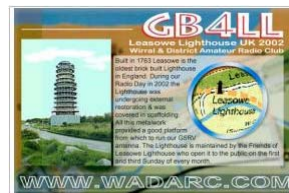
